Global

September was shaped by heightened geopolitical and economic uncertainty, driving elevated volatility and selective sector rotation. Key themes include the ongoing U.S. government shutdown, evolving trade policies, central bank monetary guidance, and the impact of geopolitical tensions. The month also saw China's government ramp up targeted pro-growth policies, including the PBoC injecting around CNY 600 billion in liquidity. This kept annual GDP growth on track for 5%, supporting market sentiment, and reflected Beijing's focus on sustaining consumption and strategic manufacturing even as domestic demand and private investment remained fragile.

The U.S. government shutdown, which began on October 1, 2025, has furloughed about 750,000 federal workers and disrupted many government services. Each week of the shutdown is estimated to reduce annualised GDP growth by roughly 0.1% to 0.2%, with risks of a more severe impact if the shutdown is prolonged and leads to layoffs beyond furloughs. Key economic data releases have been delayed, adding uncertainty to policy decisions.

In October 2025, new U.S. tariffs effective from October 1 on pharmaceuticals, heavy trucks, and furniture raise concerns for global supply chains and inflation, adding uncertainty to market and economic outlooks. However, the generic manufacturers, predominantly Indian players are not likely to be impacted. 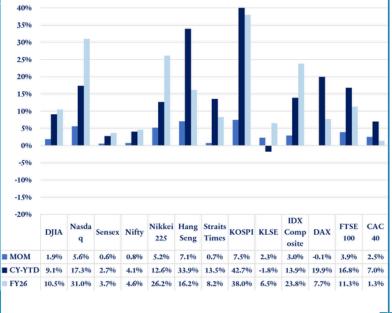
India's rollout of GST 2.0 on September 22, 2025, represents a landmark reform simplifying the indirect tax structure into two main slabs: 5% for essentials and FMCG, and 18% for sectors like electronics and automobiles, with a higher 40% "sin/luxury" rate for premium goods. This rationalization reduces compliance burdens and is expected to ease inflation by ~1% point, potentially boosting consumer demand ahead of the critical festive season.

A few indicators showed moderation, such as the Manufacturing PMI eased to 57.7 and the Services PMI declined to 60.9, reflecting slightly slower demand. Electricity generation grew 3.2%, lower than August, due to reduced industrial activity and monsoon impacts.

On the fiscal side, GST collections rose 9.1% to ₹1.89 lakh crore, showing steady domestic consumption. Consumer Price Index inflation inched up to 2.07%, staying within the RBI's 2–6% target range. Overall, September's data points to sustained growth amid moderate sectoral slowdowns.

Outlook: H2 FY26 remains positive, supported by several tailwinds. The recent GST cuts are expected to boost consumption, which is visible from the first few days of Navaratri sales and auto sales numbers for September. A good monsoon is likely to strengthen rural demand and agricultural output. Additionally, any relaxation or moderation in U.S. tariffs could ease pressures on exportoriented sectors. Together, these factors are likely to support corporate earnings, sustain domestic growth momentum, and reinforce resilience against external uncertainties.
